

“Where can people touch me?” Book (boy)

Directions to make the activity:

Laminate and cut out each page. Bind the book. Laminate and cut out the “pointer” icons. Attach Soft Velcro to the back of each “pointer” picture symbol. Attach Hard Velcro onto different body parts (both public and private).

How to use this activity:

Your child has to place a pointer icon on places on the body that are appropriate to be touched.

Adaptations

- Ask your child to read the question and provide the correct answer verbally
- Your child writes down the answers for each question either on the book or on a separate piece of paper.

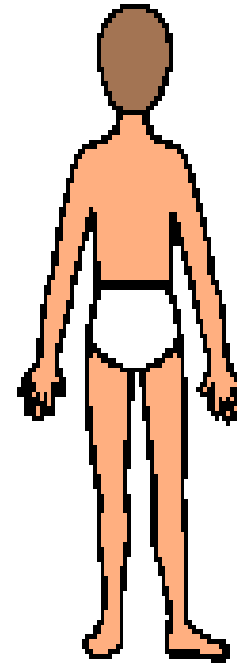
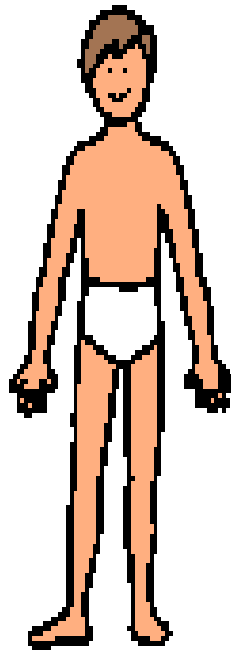
